

- Fashion- changing fads, returning styles- what was popular in 2015



WE WON!



A year ago, I heard the following statement. “Your website has holes large enough to drive a Mack truck through it.” This is something no one wants to hear. Our website had more than serious problems. We were running a real risk of losing the newspaper database, 29 years of work. Two years ago we had begun the process of surveying members and visitors in preparation for rebuilding the website. The results of the survey were clear: people wanted more research tools, access to photos, and history articles. Through the help of a Legacy grant, a new site was designed with the visitor in mind: books and memberships could now be purchased on-line, and plat maps could be researched. Unique features included satellite images with 1880 plat map overlay, and access to the CCHS photo collection. Creating a more up-to-date and user-friendly website has allowed the CCHS to maintain an online presence and allowed people from around the world continued access to our collections and resources. The whole process took just short of three years.

This spring we nominated the website for a Minnesota Council of Nonprofits Dot.org Award. It was to our great excitement to hear that we won in the category of website redesign. With any project, many people are involved. It would be impossible to mention each one, but know this is an award that needs to be shared with many people. If you have not yet checked out the site you can find us at www.carvercountyhistoricalsociety.org. Members received a passcode to access the photo indexing. However, if someone you know is not a member, they can access the photos for free at any Carver County Library or at the CCHS.

On March 23rd I received notice from our attorney that the settlement agreement for the farm had been signed by Ward Holasek’s sons. The document arrived the week of March 30th and was signed by us. Now we wait for the judges’ final signature and that of two charities listed in the will.

The day after Ward Holasek died, we received notice that we had won a Legacy grant for a Master plan for the Andrew Peterson farm. This plan was deferred until we knew the property swap was progressing. The plan will be completed no later than the end of April. I have been taking the opportunity to visit groups and people to see what they want to see happen at the farm. So far we have 18 organizations who would like to partner with us. The most prevalent desire expressed in surveys is for agricultural education followed closely by a venue for larger events.

This is our 75th Anniversary and we have many things planned. One thing that we have never done is send out a fundraising letter in the spring. This spring a letter will be sent out asking for funds to ensure there will be a 150th anniversary celebration. You can expect the letter by early May.

The Governor's Task force on the Civil War will be commemorating Civil War soldier Andrew Mattson. Mattson was interred in the deadly prison camp, Andersonville. He died shortly after returning to Laketown Township. He is buried in the Scandia Cemetery. The event will be held in July. No date is confirmed at the time of this printing.

This summer at the fair we are hosting a blacksmith demonstration. The granary will host photos of blacksmithing shops and blacksmithing artifacts.

On a sad note, our Curator has moved on to bigger and better things. We wish her only the best in her new endeavors.


History Explorers Camp, Week of July 27-31


